

Stay in [Glasgow](#), [Nairn](#), [Edinburgh](#), [Dublin](#), [Killarney](#) and [Bunratty](#) while venturing out to [Loch Lomond](#), [St. Andrews](#), [Belfast](#), [Blarney](#), [Galway](#), [Clonmacnoise](#) and more. Among other things, cruise [Loch Ness](#), sample whisky, take the ferry to Belfast, visit the [Titanic museum](#), kiss the [Blarney stone](#) and take the scenic drive through the [Ring of Kerry](#).



The following features are included:

- Private motorcoach transportation from the Washburn campus to the Kansas City airport and return.
- Airfare between Kansas City and Scotland, returning from Dublin, international taxes and fuel surcharges. (Other departure cities available, pricing may vary).
- 10-night first class and superior first class overnight accommodations including 1 night in Glasgow; 1 night in Nairn; 2 nights in Edinburgh; 3 nights in Dublin; 2 nights in Killarney; 1 night in Bunratty
- 10 breakfasts, 1 lunch, and 7 dinners including a Scottish evening in Edinburgh, a rustic pub dinner in Dundalk, and a festive medieval castle banquet in Bunratty

DAY 1 – Saturday, Oct. 5 - TOPEKA / KANSAS CITY / OVERNIGHT FLIGHT

Private deluxe motorcoach will transport the group from Washburn University to Kansas City International Airport for your flight to Scotland (flights subject to change). Other cities are available. Overnight: International airline flight.



DAY 2 – Sunday, Oct. 6, May 15 – ARRIVE SCOTLAND (D)

Arrive in Scotland, board your private motorcoach, and drive to your hotel. Later, set out on an introductory tour of central [Glasgow](#). Drive around [George Square](#) and visit [Provand's Lordship](#), Glasgow's oldest house. Later, gather for a welcome dinner.

Overnight: [Doubletree by Hilton Glasgow Central](#) – Glasgow.



DAY 3 – Monday, Oct. 7 – GLASGOW / FORT WILLIAM / NAIRN (B D)

Breakfast at the hotel, then travel alongside the famous [Loch Lomond](#), renowned for its unsurpassed beauty. Drive across the haunting [Rannoch Moor](#) and through [Glencoe](#), admiring the wild and spectacular scenery. Continue through [Fort William](#) and stop at a woollen mill to shop for quality Scottish goods. Embark on a short cruise on [Loch Ness](#) before heading to [Nairn](#). Later, gather for dinner.

Overnight: [Muthu Newton Hotel](#) – Nairn.



DAY 4 – Tuesday, Oct. 8 – PITLOCHRY / ST. ANDREWS / EDINBURGH (B D)

Breakfast at the hotel, then drive to [Blair Athol Distillery](#) to see how whisky is distilled and enjoy a sample. Travel to [St. Andrews](#), best known as the "Home of Golf." Take a panoramic drive around and spend some time exploring independently. Continue to [Edinburgh](#) to your gracious manor house hotel, set on 1,000 acres with [two golf courses](#). Enjoy a Scottish evening with traditional cuisine, along with a lively show of songs, stories, and dancing.

Overnight: [Dalmahoy Hotel and Country Club](#) – Edinburgh.



DAY 5 – Wednesday, Oct. 9 - EDINBURGH (B)

Breakfast at the hotel, then explore the principal sights of central Edinburgh and the bustling Princes Street through the 200-year-old Georgian "[New Town](#)." Visit [Edinburgh Castle](#), home to the [Scottish Crown Jewels](#) and the [Stone of Scone](#). The balance of the day is free to explore on your own. Dinner tonight is on your own

Overnight: [Dalmahoy Hotel and Country Club](#) – Edinburgh.



DAY 6 – Thursday, Oct. 10 – EDINBURGH / AYRSHIRE / BELFAST / DUNDALK / DUBLIN (B D)

Breakfast at the hotel, depart Edinburgh and travel through [Ayrshire](#) and along the coast. Embark on a ferry ride to Belfast. At [Titanic Belfast](#), immerse yourself in the history of this famous liner through state-of-the-art displays. Head to [Dundalk](#) for a pub dinner, and then travel to your hotel in Dublin.

Overnight: [Trinity City Hotel](#) – Dublin.



DAY 7 – Friday, Oct. 11 - DUBLIN (B D)

Breakfast at the hotel, then discover central [Dublin](#) with a local guide. See the shopping areas around Grafton and Nassau Streets, view elegant Georgian squares, and the [General Post Office](#), where the 1916 Uprising started. Take a walk around [Christ Church Cathedral](#) founded in 1028. Board a former Guinness barge for a [canal dinner cruise](#) complete with traditional Irish music.

Overnight: [Trinity City Hotel](#) – Dublin.



DAY 8 – Saturday, Oct. 12 - DUBLIN / CASHEL / BLARNEY / KILLARNEY (B D)

Breakfast at the hotel, then travel through the midlands of Ireland, stopping for photos at the [Rock of Cashel](#). Immerse yourself in farm life with tea and scones at a farmhouse visit and watch skilled dogs herd sheep. Head to [Blarney Castle](#) and kiss the famous “[Stone of Eloquence](#).” Treat yourself to Irish goods at the [Blarney Woollen Mills](#) before heading to [Killarney](#).

Overnight: [Killarney Avenue Hotel](#) – Killarney.



Day 9 – Sunday, Oct. 13 - KILLARNEY / VALENTIA ISLAND / SNEEM (B L)

Breakfast at the hotel, then step back on a drive past [Ross Castle](#) set on Lough Leane. Embark on the [Ring of Kerry](#) drive -- a winding route with breathtaking sights of mountains and coastal views. Cross the bridge to [Valentia Island](#) to visit the [Skellig Experience](#), which explains the life of early Christian hermits on [Skellig Michael](#), a rocky offshore island featured in the film “Star Wars VII.” Enjoy a casual lunch and later stop in the pretty village of [Sneem](#). Pause at [Moll’s Gap](#) for panoramic mountain views and return to Killarney where the evening is free.

Overnight: [Killarney Avenue Hotel](#) – Killarney.



Day 10 – Monday, Oct. 14 – KILLARNEY / LISLORKAN NORTH / BUNRATTY (B D)

Breakfast at the hotel, then visit the [Cliffs of Moher](#), a spectacular wall of sandstone that reaches 700 feet above the Atlantic. Later, at Bunratty Castle Hotel, you’ll have free time to visit the [Folk Park](#), have a drink in the 200-year-old [Durt Nelly’s Pub](#), or shop at the Bunratty Mills. In the evening enjoy a memorable [medieval- style feast at Bunratty Castle](#) where the lords and ladies will serenade you with song and harp music evocative of the Middle Ages.

Overnight: [Bunratty Castle Hotel](#) – Bunratty.



Day 11 – Tuesday, Oct. 15 – BUNRATTY / GALWAY/ DUBLIN (B)

Breakfast at the hotel, then head to [Galway](#) for a walking tour around the central part of the city. Visit the great monastery of [Clonmacnoise](#), founded in 546 AD by Saint Ciaran. Travel to your hotel in Dublin, where your evening is free to explore on your own.

Overnight: [Maldrone Hotel Pearse St.](#) – Dublin.



Day 12 – Wednesday, Oct. 16 – DEPART DUBLIN / KANSAS CITY (B)

Breakfast at the hotel. Later transfer to the Dublin Airport to check in for your flight home. Upon arrival at the Kansas City International Airport, your private motorcoach will meet and drive you to the Washburn University Campus in Topeka. Welcome home!

Deposit and Final Payment - A nonrefundable deposit of \$250 per person is required to confirm your reservation for the tour. Deposits and final payments may be made by check or credit card. Final payment should be by check no later than Friday, July 12, 2019. Final payment by credit card may have an applicable convenience fee.

Documentation - Tour passengers must carry proof of citizenship with them. For US citizens, this must be a U.S. passport with at least 6 months validity remaining upon return (passport cannot expire before April 16, 2020). Non-US citizens should contact Travel Leaders of Lawrence at (800) 444-4248.

Cancellation – Once deposit of \$250 is received, it is nonrefundable. In the event of an individual's cancellation after Friday, July 12, 2019 up to and including Friday, August 3, 2019, there is a \$1,000 per person cancellation fee. After Friday, August 3, 2019 up to the day of departure and while on tour, the total tour program becomes nonrefundable.
