Enjoy and experience the beauty, culture and history of Peru. Begin your journey in the ancient city of [Lima](#), then fly to [Cusco](#) and explore colonial style churches, ancient Inca culture, temples and the amazing [Sacred Valley](#). Along the way, trace the rise and fall of the Inca civilization, culminating with a visit to the breathtaking ruins of [Machu Picchu](#), one of the New Seven World Wonders.

Travel by bus to [Puno](#), stopping along the way in [Andahuayllas](#), [Racchi](#) and [Pukara](#). While in Puno, located on [Lake Titicaca](#), visit the [floating islands of the Uro people](#), an ancestral society that inhabits a series of artificial islands built with totora, a reed that grows in the lake. Visit [Sillustani](#), a pre-Incan cemetery on the shores of [Lake Umayo](#). Board a plane back to Lima and further explore the city visiting the [Barranco](#) and [Miraflores](#) districts, the [Museo de Osma](#), the [Mario Testino Art Gallery](#) and [Larcomar](#).

The following features are included:

- Private motorcoach transportation from the Washburn campus to the Kansas City airport and return.
- Roundtrip airfare between Kansas City and Lima, one way airfare from Lima to Cusco, and one way from Juliaca to Lima including the base airfare, international taxes and fuel surcharges. (Other departure cities available, pricing may vary).
- Eight nights first class hotel accommodations
- 8 breakfasts, 7 lunches and 1 dinner
- Private motorcoach transportation following the day to day itinerary, including all sightseeing with an English-speaking guide and admission fees.
- Luggage handling for one (1) piece of luggage for each person on the flights, motorcoach and hotels where available.
- Alumni Association staff member will accompany the group.
- Final travel documents for each couple or single individual including travel documents, luggage tags, tourist information and final instructions for the group.

DAY 1 – Friday, Oct. 6 - TOPEKA / KANSAS CITY / LIMA

Private deluxe motorcoach will transport the group from Washburn University to Kansas City International Airport for your flight on Delta Airlines to Lima (flights subject to change).

Your flight arrives just prior to midnight, then board the motorcoach and head straight to the hotel for a late check-in. Lima is in the Eastern Time zone, so it's only an hour's difference from the time in Topeka.

DAY 2 – Saturday, Oct. 7 - ARRIVE LIMA (B L)

Breakfast at the hotel, then begin touring downtown [Lima](#), where you will visit the Main Square, where Lima was first founded as "The City of Kings," in 1535. See the [Presidential Palace](#), the [Archbishop's Palace](#) and the [Cathedral of Lima](#). Visit the [Aliaga House](#), [Saint Francis' Church](#) and [Larco Museum](#). Lunch is included today at [Cafe del Museo Larco](#). Return to the hotel. The remainder of the afternoon is free to explore Lima on your own. Overnight: Lima – Overnight: [Habitat Hotel](#) - Lima

DAY 3 – Sunday, Oct. 8 – LIMA/CUSCO/URUBAMBA (B L)

Breakfast at your hotel, then head to the airport for your flight to Cusco. Upon arrival, begin your [Sacred Valley](#) tour. Visit the [Pisac Market](#), which has countless products manufactured by the residents of the area. Beautiful alpaca textiles, musical instruments, paintings, carvings, necklaces and replicas of old Inca pieces stand out. You will continue to the [Pisac archaeological vestiges](#), which as the largest complex of terraces in the area and a masterpiece of the agriculture of the Inca Empire. A buffet lunch is included today at a local restaurant. After lunch, continue to the studio of [Pablo and Marilu Seminario](#) – artisans who have devoted 20 years to the study of Pre-Colombian pottery techniques and designs, incorporating these ancient traditions into their own beautiful works. Return to the hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening on your own. Overnight: [La Casona de Yucay Hotel](#) - Urubamba



DAY 4 – Monday, Oct. 9 - URUBAMBA (B L)

Breakfast at your hotel, then visit the archaeological vestiges of [Maras](#) and [Moray](#). Maras is an impressive salt mine complex. Moray's archaeological vestiges are composed of mysterious concentric circular terraces which, according to some scholars, would be an agricultural research center. A buffet lunch is included today at a local restaurant. Continue the trip to the [Ollantaytambo Park](#), stopping at various points of interest along the route. Ollantaytambo is a typical example of the urban planning of the Incas, whose residents still live in accordance with their old traditions. Return to the hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening on your own. Overnight: [La Casona de Yucay Hotel](#) - Urubamba



DAY 5 – Tuesday, Oct. 10 - URUBAMBA/MACHU PICCHU/CUSCO (B L)

Breakfast at your hotel, then head to the Ollantaytambo train station. Your tour to Machu Picchu begins with a two hour [Vistadome train ride](#) to Aguas Calientes, also known as "Machu Picchu pueblo." Take a short [bus ride](#) up the mountain where you will reach [Machu Picchu](#), a masterpiece of engineering and architecture that is believed served as a sanctuary and retreat for the Inca Pachacutec (1438 - 1572). Machu Picchu, which means "Old Mountain," is considered a World Heritage by UNESCO and one of the New Seven Wonders of the World. Lunch is included today at Belmond Sanctuary Lodge. In the afternoon, board the shuttle bus back to Aguas Calientes to board the Vistadome train to Ollantaytambo. Check into your Cusco hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening on your own. Overnight: [Hotel Eco Inn](#) - Cusco



DAY 6 – Wednesday, Oct. 11 – CUSCO (B,D)

Breakfast at your hotel, then visit [Coricancha](#), also known as the "Temple of the Sun." Go to the [Cathedral](#), the most important building on the Main Square. Its construction lasted almost a century, it started in 1560 and ended in 1654. Visit the [Sacsayhuamán](#) fortress, an emblematic work of the Incas, which protected the Holy City. You will then go to [Qenqo](#), an archaeological complex mainly used for religious purposes, and it is believed that agricultural rituals took place there. Finish the day with a visit the vestiges of [Puka Pukara](#), which means "red fortress," an architectural complex presumably used for military purposes. Return to the hotel. In the evening enjoy dinner and a show at [Tunupa Restaurant](#) on the main square of Cusco. The evening includes ancestral music and folk dances, together with a novo-andian dinner buffet with international cuisine.
Overnight: [Hotel Eco Inn](#) - Cusco



DAY 7 – Thursday, Oct. 12 – CUSCO/PUNO (B L)

Breakfast at the hotel, then board the motorcoach for your transfer to [Puno](#). You'll make three stops along the way. First visit [Andahuayllas](#), a village located 40 kilometers from Cusco, seeing its most important attraction, the church of Andahuayllas, also called "The Sistine Chapel of America." Continue on to [Racchi](#), where you will find the [Temple of Viracocha](#). Stop for lunch in Sicuani. Then head to the town of [Pukara](#), the first settlement of the highland lake city and developed between 100 and 300 BC. Then arrive in Puno. Enjoy dinner on your own. Overnight: [Hotel Jose Antonio](#) – Puno



DAY 8 – Friday, Oct. 13 - PUNO (B L)

Breakfast at your hotel, then head to the lake port and board a boat that will take you to the [floating islands of the Uros](#). After a one and a half-hour tour, you will continue your trip to the [Taquile Island](#). Unlike other islands, inhabited by Aymara-speaking people on the lake, its residents speak Quechua. They will give you a brief presentation about the island and you will tour it until lunch time. After having lunch, you will walk to the main pier to return to Puno's port. The remainder of the evening is on your own.
Overnight: [Hotel Jose Antonio](#) – Puno



DAY 9 – Saturday, Oct. 14 (B L)

Breakfast at the hotel, then head to [Sillustani](#), a pre-Incan cemetery on the shores of [Lake Umayo](#) near Puno. More than 90 [chullpas](#), huge and primitive stone mausoleums, housed the remains of entire families. After your visit, you will be transferred to the Juliaca airport for your flight to Lima. Upon arrival, board your motorcoach and visit the [Museo de Osma](#) where you will see a wide collection of Peruvian colonial art. Then visit the [Mario Testino Art Gallery](#) (MATE), where the famous Peruvian photographer exhibits his world famous photographs. Afterwards, enjoy a panoramic view of the [Barranco](#) and [Miraflores](#) districts of Lima. Next you will be taken to [Larcomar](#) where you will have free time for shopping and dinner on your own. Later, at a coordinated time, meet your guide and transfer to the airport to board your international flight for your overnight flight home.



Day 10 – Sunday, Oct. 15 - HOME (B)

Depart on a red-eye flight leaving Lima at approximately 1 a.m. Breakfast on board the flight before landing in Atlanta, then catch your connecting flight home. Your private motorcoach will meet you at the Kansas City airport to drive you to the Washburn campus. Welcome home.
